Gas Pipeline Safety (GPS) attended and spoke at the Alabama Natural Gas Association's (ANGA) annual meeting. During the meeting, GPS provided a regulatory update, covering the current state of the state program, and common violations identified statewide. We also outlined key focus areas for the standard inspections. The conference allowed for valuable informal interactions between inspectors and pipeline operators, fostering stronger working relationships and promoting a safer environment within Alabama.

This memorandum reflects the Utility Enforcement Division's (UED) report describing the major tasks, inspections and activities accomplished by its staff during the month of June 2024.

RAILWAY SAFETY

The track inspection results below reflect activity by our Railway Safety (RWS) Staff in the field.

There were three incidents reported by the National Response Center (NRC) in June:

1. A vehicle strike with one fatality and unknown injuries in Evergreen on **CSX**.
2. A log truck strike with no reported injuries in Thomasville on **NS**.
3. An unoccupied vehicle strike at a grade crossing in Anniston on **NS**.

RWS Staff participated in the Heart of Dixie Railroad's Safety Day on June 7th. At this event, staff set up a booth to inform the public about railroad safety and how to properly file complaints and provide information when unsafe acts or conditions are found. Our staff contacted and shared information with over 1,100 people at the event.

The RWS Administrator started field training in Operating Practices OJT in June. He has completed ten percent of the OJT coursework and training.

As of June 30, there were 8,780 Alabama carriers (90%) registered for 2024 UCR with 906 remaining unregistered.

MCS staff participated in the UCR Board call during the month.

Our office received three For Non-Profit (FNP) quarterly reports for the first quarter of 2024 during the month.

Staff received seven annual reports for the year ended 2023 from household goods and passenger carriers in June.

In June, one passenger tariff for **24 Transportation LLC dba Platinum Chauffeured Transportation Services (C4161)** was rejected but later accepted after working with staff to make the necessary corrections.

Staff participated in two passenger carrier hearings that were held during June for:

- **Scott's Transportation, LLC**
- **Joyride Company LLC**

Three desk audits were completed on the following household goods carriers:

- **Macon Trading Post, Inc. dba Trading Post (C3199)** – One minor issue was found, and the carrier was instructed to have the vehicle weighed by a weight master or certified scale and obtain weight tickets when conducting moves 31 miles or more.
- **David R. Burkhalter dba Econo Moving Company (C3919)** – No issues were found.
- **Crocker Moving Services, L.L.C. (C4106)** – Multiple issues were found. A meeting has been scheduled to instruct the carrier on calculating charges through the tariff and what is expected of the carrier during intrastate moves.

The Common Equity as of June 30, 2024 (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2024 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using actual and budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 95.28%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated by using actual data for the six months ended June 30, 2024, and then adding six months of budget data for July through December 2024. The Other Adjustments, if any, are the result of the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires the reporting of stock option expenses.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns and economic conditions across the state.

DOCKET 33455 (B) - APSC v. Delinquent Companies (that failed to timely pay inspection/supervision fees). The Commission has received the inspection and supervision fee and late fee from Extenet Asset Entity, LLC.

Recommend: Reinstatement of Extenet Asset Entity, LLC.

DOCKET 33063 (B) - Application of UZURV Holdings, Inc. d/b/a UZURV ("UZURV") for renewal of its permit to operate as a transportation network company in the State of Alabama. UZURV filed for permit renewal after the deadline and remitted the late fee pursuant to Rule TNC-3.

DOCKET 32744 (B) - In re: Regulation of Transportation Network Companies. Rule TNC-3 dictates the process for TNC permit applications and renewals. After several permit renewal cycles, Commission Staff has recognized that the current rule may lead to timing issues during the permit renewal process and may not allow sufficient time for Staff review. Staff proposes amending Rule TNC-3(6) to extend the permit validity period from 12 months to 14 months.

Rule TNC-3 also describes a process for revocation of a TNC permit for failure to timely renew the permit. This revocation process is unnecessary because a TNC permit becomes invalid if not renewed before the expiration of the permit. Therefore, Staff proposes removing the unnecessary language regarding revocation from Rule TNC-3(8).

Recommend: Initiation of rulemaking proceeding to consider the above-stated proposed changes to Rule TNC-3 regarding the TNC permit renewal and revocation processes.
