Jemison Machine & Welding, Inc., was granted Trucking Authority in 2008. We recently experienced problems with cargo insurance and received a letter stating that our Trucking Authority has been revoked.

The purpose of this letter is to inquire about having the Trucking Authority of Jemison Machine and Welding, Inc. reinstated in consideration of the following information.

The Order of Revocation states that it was revoked because we did not furnish proof of cargo insurance. Our understanding was that since we were granted status as "self-insured" on May 14, 2008, we were under the impression that we did not need cargo insurance since we are self-insured. However, we did have cargo insurance all along because it was required if we carried cargo for a certain trucking customer. Once this relationship with this customer was over, we mistakenly assumed we could drop our cargo insurance. Since we learned that we do indeed need the cargo insurance, we have obtained it from Babs & Associates Insurance. Babs & Associates has forwarded a form H and an ID12 to you.

We apologize for this mistake and ask that you please reinstate our trucking authority. We are a small, family-owned company and would appreciate your help in this matter.
