REPORT AND ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed on or about March 23, 2023, Gary Johnson d/b/a TransitExpress / Easy Ryde Alabama, 2239-A Hill Street, Mt. Vernon, Alabama, 36560, sought authority to institute a new operation as a common carrier by motor vehicle in intrastate commerce over irregular routes in the transportation of Passengers and their baggage between all points in Mobile County.

Pursuant to notice dated April 7, 2023, the application was set for hearing and heard on April 26, 2023. No notice of intention to protest was filed and no one appeared at the hearing in opposition to the application. The application, therefore, went forward unopposed.

Following the hearing, multiple questions arose from staff regarding the nature of the operations proposed by the Applicant. After internal discussions and further inquiries to the Applicant, staff obtained the additional clarity needed to recommend a grant of the application.

It therefore appears, and we find, that the Applicant is fit, willing and able to properly perform the service proposed and to conform with the provisions of the Alabama Motor Carrier Act and the Commission's Motor Carrier Rules and that the proposed service is required by the public convenience and necessity. The Applicant waived its right to the issuance of a Report and Recommended Order in this cause.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED BY THE COMMISSION, That Motor Carrier Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity 4192 is hereby issued to Gary Johnson d/b/a TransitExpress / Easy Ryde Alabama, 2239-A Hill Street, Mt. Vernon, Alabama, 36560, authorizing operations as a common carrier by motor vehicle in

intrastate commerce over irregular routes in the transportation of Passengers and their baggage between all points in

Mobile County.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED BY THE COMMISSION, That the operations herein authorized may be

commenced only after the Applicant has filed with this Commission evidence of liability insurance and a tariff, and

has obtained registration numbers and properly identified its vehicles as required by the rules and regulations of this

Commission. Unless the Applicant complies with these requirements within ninety (90) days after the date of this

Order, or within such additional time as may be authorized by the Commission, the grant of authority made in this

Order shall be considered as null and void and the application shall stand denied in its entirety effective upon the

expiration of said compliance time.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED BY THE COMMISSION, That the operations herein authorized shall be

subject to all the rights, privileges, and immunities as well as all the restrictions, liabilities and responsibilities that

are now or may hereafter be imposed by law or the rules and regulations of this Commission upon common carriers

by motor vehicle.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That this Order shall be effective as of the date hereof.
