Based on preliminary figures at point-of-test January 31, 2022, the projected RSE return on average common equity for the rate year ending September 30, 2022, was 9.90 percent, which was below the authorized range and results in no adjustment to rates. The authorized return on average common equity is 10.15 to 10.65 percent.

Docket 28101 SPIRE GULF INC. -- Division Report on Rate RSE as of January 31, 2022

Based on preliminary figures as of January 31, 2022, the projected RSE return on average common equity for the rate year ending September 30, 2022, was 8.58 percent. The authorized return on average common equity is 9.70 to 10.30 percent.

From the forty-seven (47) inspections shown above, thirty (30) non-compliance issues were corrected during the month of January. No enforcement letters of notification were issued for the month.

Incidents/Accidents

One state-reportable incident was reported during the month of January:

- 1/14/2022 – Southeast Gas (Montgomery) – Logging operator ran over a 3/4" high-pressure regulator setting and broke it off at ground level

Training

Two (2) operator/contractor training sessions on Polyethylene (PE) plastic fusion were conducted during the month of January:

- 1/19/2022 – Southern Directional (Contractor) 45 Personnel Qualified
- 1/24/2022 – General Maintenance (Contractor) 8 Personnel Qualified

Miscellaneous

A report was published in November 2021 by “Continuum Capital for the Infrastructure Protection Coalition (IPC), a coalition of industry groups who represent regular users and stakeholders in the 811 system and want to see it run safely and efficiently.” However, after reading the report, Alabama 811 and several other state groups had very serious concerns about the facts included in the report. Alabama 811’s Executive Director, Ms. Annette Bowman, after consultation with the Alabama 811 Board of Directors, issued a response to Continuum Capital highlighting the many discrepancies that were noted in their initial report. On January 12, 2022, a virtual meeting was held with representatives from the National Association of Regulatory Commissioners (NARUC), the National Association of Pipeline Safety Representatives (NAPSR), Continuum Capital and IPC. The discrepancies from the states were discussed, but Continuum Capital was not responsive to issuing a new and revised report. They did give NAPSR six weeks to send in their revisions, but with no guarantees that these would be used in a revised report.

On January 21, 2022, Mr. Wallace Jones, Gas Pipeline Safety Division Director, participated in a virtual meeting with the Government Accounting Office (GAO). This meeting was held to discuss the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration’s (PHMSA) pipeline enforcement actions and to develop a report to submit to Congress with any recommendations for improvements. Most of this discussion centered around states that are interstate agents for PHMSA. Alabama is not an interstate agent but participated in those areas relating to intrastate enforcement actions.

Mr. Jones worked with the State Personnel Department to develop the *Pipeline Engineering Graduate – Senior (20426)* classification. This new classification will be a “promotional only” category for the *Pipeline Engineering Graduate* personnel in Gas Pipeline Safety. This classification will allow upward mobility to the *Pipeline Safety Investigations Supervisor* classification.

RAILWAY SAFETY

There were five incidents reported by the National Response Center in January:

RWS Staff joined in monthly strategy and training calls hosted by the FRA for their respective disciplines. These conference calls ensure consistency in regulatory enforcement between state and federal inspection forces.

As of January 31, there were 7,790 Alabama carriers (66%) registered for 2022 UCR with 3,955 that remain unregistered. Our office received funds from the UCR Depository for December online payments processed through the National Registration System (NRS) that came from 2,979 carriers that were domiciled in Alabama and some that were in non-participating states.

In January, \$2,799 was collected for Focused Anomaly Reviews (FARs) audits for the 2022 UCR registration year.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There were ten MCS-150 forms processed indicating that two motor carriers' USDOT numbers were deactivated and eight forms contained updates to carriers' USDOT number data.

MCS staff attended the UCR Board call and UCR Board Education and Training Subcommittee call both held in January.

The staff received 22 For Non-Profit (FNP) quarterly reports from FNP carriers for the fourth quarter of 2021. Also during the month, 70 FNP quarterly reports for the fourth quarter of 2021 were sent by mail and e-mail.

In January, there was one passenger tariff for **M & M Mobility Incorporated d/b/a Careavan Transport (C4058)** accepted. Three household goods tariffs for **All My Sons Moving & Storage of Birmingham, LLC (C3915)**, **All My Sons Moving & Storage of Pensacola, LLC (C4078)** and **Scott R. Enterprises, LLC d/b/a College Hunks Hauling Junk and Moving (NEW)** were accepted.

The staff completed a compliance audit for the following carrier:

- **Haynes Ambulance of Troy, L.L.C. d/b/a Haynes Ambulance of Troy (C4081)** – Carrier is currently conducting transportation for Medicaid passengers and must apply for For Non-Profit authority.

The staff attended passenger carrier hearings for the following companies:

- **Johnny McDowell Sr. d/b/a Skinners Transportation Service** – no protestants
- **Bryant's Limousine, LLC** – no protestants

The Common Equity as of December 31, 2021 (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2022 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 95.15%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated by using twelve months of budget data for January through December 2022. The Other Adjustments, if any, are the result of the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires the reporting of stock option expenses.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns and economic conditions across the state.

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Dockets 18117 On February 1, 2022, Alabama Power Company (“the Company”) submitted information and calculations for the CNP Purchase Factors associated with the and 18416 Company’s certificated power purchase arrangements, as provided for under Rate CNP, Part B. The filing reflects a projected under-recovery of costs associated with such arrangements which would be recoverable in the billing months of April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023.

Although the Company is entitled under Rate CNP and the corresponding orders of the Commission to recover the entire revenue requirement associated with its power purchase arrangements, the staff is proposing that, in lieu of new CNP Purchase Factors associated with the submitted calculations, the Company will leave the current CNP Purchase Factors in effect for the period April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023.

Recommendation: Approval

Docket 18005 On February 15, 2022, Alabama Power Company filed with the Alabama Public Service Commission the annual update to Rate PAE. Under Rate PAE, qualifying customers that have installed an electric generating facility for their own use (with nameplate capacity of 100 kW or less) receive payment for energy sold to the Company in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 (PURPA). As with prior revisions, the base charges and energy payments reflect updated cost information and avoided cost data for Alabama Power Company. Alabama Power is also proposing a new PAE option for residential customers that elect to take service under the recently approved Rate FD-D (Family Dwelling - Residential Service Demand). Rate FD-D becomes available for customers beginning with April 2022 billings. Lastly, the Company is proposing several clarifying and ministerial changes associated with the different time periods applicable to the different service options available under the tariff. The Company has requested the proposed modifications become effective for April 2022 billings.

Docket U-5213 On February 15, 2022, Alabama Power Company filed with the Alabama Public Service Commission the annual update to Rate CPE (Contract for Purchased Energy). Rate CPE applies to Qualifying Facilities (“QFs”) with a nameplate capacity greater than 100 kW, seeking to sell energy to Alabama Power Company. Under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 and its implementing regulations, Alabama Power is obligated to purchase energy from QFs at rates equivalent to the Company’s avoided costs. Rate CPE has been in effect since March 2017, and the Company annually updates avoided cost and other data that are used to set the energy payments established under the rate. The Company has requested the new rates become effective April 1, 2022.

Recommendation: Approval

Docket U-5055 On February 15, 2022, Alabama Power filed with the Alabama Public Service Commission a petition seeking approval to modify Rate Rider PEV (“Plug-In Electric Vehicle”) to expand the residential rate schedules eligible for service and to provide clarifications as to the eligibility requirements and administration of the Rate Rider. The proposed revisions would become effective with April 2022 billings.
