Enforcement Actions

From the sixty (60) inspections shown above, eight (8) enforcement letters of notification were issued leading to thirty-five (35) non-compliance issues. There were thirty-five (35) non-compliance items corrected during the month of February.

Incidents / Accidents

There were two (2) state reportable incidents, and zero (0) federal incidents reported during the month of February.

- 2/28/2025 Spire Alabama – Opelika – While investigating a reported leak, a gas distribution valve was found to be leaking. The repair required a crew to work on the valve with only a reduction in pressure. Due to the valve's proximity to public areas and roadways, Spire had to restrict access to the area until the repair was successfully completed.
- 2/28/2025 Mobile Bay – A pipeline was reported as floating in Mobile Bay by W&T Offshore. Inspectors worked to confirm that the pipeline was not an asset of W&T Offshore or Williams Field Services, the only two jurisdictional operators in the area. After verification, it was determined that the pipeline did not belong to either operator. PHMSA and the Alabama Oil and Gas Board were notified of the situation to conduct their own investigations and make further determinations.

Miscellaneous

Gas Pipeline Safety received a request from the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) regarding available dates for the Annual Audit. The office audit has been scheduled for March, and the field audit is set for May.

The National Response Center (NRC) reported one incident in February:

1. A small release of propionaldehyde in a rail yard in Muscle Shoals on NS.

The track inspection staff partnered with the FRA inspectors from north Alabama, Mississippi, Tennessee, and Georgia to conduct a focused inspection of the Mobile and Dothan area railroads. The FRA has had a vacancy in the south Alabama area for several months. RWS staff determined that an inspection effort involving all track inspectors and the FRA to participate would be beneficial since fewer regulatory inspections were being conducted in the area.

As of February 28th, 7,143 Alabama carriers (82%) were registered for 2025 UCR with 1,530 remaining unregistered. Our office received funds from the UCR Depository for January online payments processed through the National Registration System (NRS) from 1,291 carriers domiciled in Alabama and non-participating states.

In February, \$1,374.00 was collected for Focused Anomaly Reviews (FARs) audits for the 2025 UCR registration year.

MCS staff participated in the UCR Audit Subcommittee call and the UCR Finance Subcommittee call during the month.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). Seven MCS-150 forms were processed. Four motor carriers had their USDOT number deactivated, and three forms contained updates to the motor carriers' USDOT number data.

Our office received six For Non-Profit (FNP) quarterly reports for the fourth quarter of 2024 during the month.

A total of 159 household goods and passenger carrier annual reports for the year ending 2024 were mailed in February.

In February, one taxi tariff for **Preferred NEMT L.L.C. (C41514)** and one household goods tariff for **AAA Associates Moving & Storage, L.L.C. dba Day Transfer Company (C4175)** were received and accepted.

Staff participated in one passenger carrier hearing held during February for:

- **Junior Lee Jordan dba A – 24/7 Taxi**

One desk audit was completed on the following household goods carrier:

- **McCorquodale Transfer, Inc. (C3783)** – Several issues were found, and the carrier was required to address discrepancies in one of the moves audited.

As of February 28, 2025, the Common Equity (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2025 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using actual and budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 95.36%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated using actual data for the two months ended February 28, 2025, and then adding ten months of budget data for March through December 2025. The Other Adjustments, if any, result from the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires the reporting of stock option expenses.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns, and economic conditions across the state.
