This memorandum reflects activities of the Gas Pipeline Safety (GPS) Division that will be presented at the April 2, 2019 Commission Meeting.

> GPS performed the following inspections during the month of February 2019:

- ➤ There were five (5) enforcement letters of notification issued during February, noting seven (7) non-compliance issues. There were thirteen (13) non-compliance items corrected during the month of February.
- ➤ No Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA)-reportable incidents were reported during the month of February. Three incidents meeting the state-reportable criteria were received during February:
 - 1) Two incidents involved a vehicle leaving the roadway and striking a highpressure regulator station;
 - 2) A landslide caused a 4" steel main to be pulled from a fitting due to the recent heavy rainfalls.

- > Three operator/contractor training sessions on Polyethylene (PE) plastic fusion and natural gas firefighting techniques were conducted during the month of February:
 - 1) 2/5/2019 Spire Alabama (Bessemer) (Fire)
- 37 Personnel Qualified
- 2) 2/19/2019 Leak City (Athens) (PE)
- 30 Personnel Qualified
- 3) 2/21/2019 Spire Alabama (Bessemer) (PE)
- 49 Personnel Qualified
- > Mr. Wallace Jones, Director of Gas Pipeline Safety Division, met with the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Office and other damage prevention stakeholders on February 7th to discuss possible changes to the Alabama Damage Prevention Law. Discussions have been on-going since the "One-Call System Study Commission" submitted its report to the Governor and the Alabama Legislature. The Consumer Protection Office has been handling submittals to their office for underground damages but would like to have other entities involved in the damage prevention processes. This will require changes to the Alabama Code and the stakeholder group is continuing to work on this in the areas of mandatory membership and damage enforcement.
- > On February 13th Mr. Jones met with other members of the Alabama Damage Prevention Alliance at the quarterly meeting. Changes to the Alabama Damage Prevention Law, the Damage Prevention Summit for 2019 and the election of officers were some of the items of discussion.
- > The audit of all Gas Pipeline Safety Division equipment was conducted on February 25th. All items were accounted for and no discrepancies were noted.

This memorandum reflects the Utility Enforcement Division's (UED) report describing the major tasks, inspections and activities accomplished by its staff during the month of February 2019.

RAILWAY SAFETY

The track inspection results below reflect activity by our Railway Safety (RWS) Staff in the field.

There were also four inspection days where the staff assisted the Automated Track Inspection Program (ATIP) car which operated over an additional 293 track miles on four rail carriers. Thirteen non-compliant conditions were identified and two were recommended for violations. All of those non-compliant conditions were cited by Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) personnel.

The table below reflects track safety observations made in which no non-compliant condition was found. Three bridge workers were observed and 31 roadway workers' safety practices were witnessed during the course of their maintenance and construction operations.

One incident was reported in February that required RWS involvement. A derailment occurred in Vance involving a freight train that was switching an industry and derailed several empty gondola cars due to a human error. There were no injuries and the only damage incurred was to the gondola cars.

MOTOR CARRIER SERVICES

The Motor Carrier Services (MCS) staff accomplished the following matters regarding state authority to operate as a motor carrier in Alabama with proof of insurance coverage:

We received six motor carrier annual reports for 2018. There were 162 household goods and passenger 2018 annual reports mailed to carriers. Six reports were received from For Non-Profit (FNP) carriers for the fourth quarter of 2018.

MCS staff members handled the tasks shown below regarding insurance coverage, prepared correspondence that challenged incorrect filings and addressed related inquiries:

In February, the staff mailed 22 letters pertaining to Focused Anomaly Reviews (FARs) for the 2019 UCR registration year. A total of \$10,453 was collected from FARs for the month. The staff handled 28 inquiries and correspondence pertaining to 2019 FARs and the 2018 UCR audit.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There were 27 MCS-150 forms processed indicating that eleven motor carriers' USDOT numbers were deactivated and 16 forms contained updates to carriers' USDOT number data.

There was no monthly meeting of the UCR Board of Directors in February.

In February, one passenger carrier's tariff was rejected [Piedmont Emergency Rescue Squad (C4085)] by the MCS staff. A household goods mover's tariff [Movers Plus LLC (new)] and a passenger carrier's tariff [Piedmont Emergency Rescue Squad (C4085)] were filed and accepted.

The staff performed an onsite compliance audit of passenger carrier, Birmingham Door To Door, L.L.C. (C3669) and suggested that they instantly update their tariff on file with the Commission. They also completed an onsite audit of household goods carrier, All My Sons Moving & Storage of Birmingham, LLC (C3915).

In addition to those onsite audits, a compliance desk audit was done on household goods mover, Knightco LLC d/b/a ASAP Moving and Delivery Service (C4032). The carrier overcharged one shipper and undercharged another. Mr. Beaty recommended that ASAP Moving and Delivery Service remit overcharges to shipper and collect the undercharges from the other shipper.

The UED Director and MCS staff attended two passenger carrier hearings that were held for the following companies:

- Royal Transportation and Shuttle LLC
- My Kiddie Cab, LLC

Transportation Network Company (TNC) field compliance audits for **Lyft**, **Inc**. and **Rasier**, **LLC** (**Uber**) were performed in Mobile. There were no major violations of APSC rules found.

The staff received two telephone calls during the month of February that were related to TNCs.

The staff also met with Uber representatives pertaining to their rider in-app support and options available for passengers to submit more details of ride conditions and issues for quality improvements.

The MCS staff addressed 43 other inquiries and requests for various other transportation-related information during the month.

FIELD SERVICES

In February, the Field Services Section (FSS) staff inspected Alabama Power Company's (APCo) Logan Martin Hydroelectric Generating Plant. At the time of the inspection, Logan Martin Dam had three major operations and maintenance (O&M) projects underway including work to their spillway gates and one of the turbines.

The staff also visited APCo's Jacksonville business office. One major construction project was in progress involving a restring plan in the area.

FSS staff met with a representative of Community Utilities of Alabama and inspected three wastewater systems located in Tallapoosa County. Each system was operating as designed with only one noticeable discrepancy at the time of the inspections. Additionally, an old power pole was abandoned in place. The FSS staff requested that the company personnel have it removed and was assured it would be taken care of that day.

The Common Equity as of February 28, 2019 (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2019 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using actual and budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 95.18%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated by using actual data for the two months ended February 28, 2019, and then adding ten months of budget data for March through December 2019. The Other Adjustments line item is the result of the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires the reporting of stock option expenses, if such expenses are incurred.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns and economic conditions across the state.
