Based on preliminary figures at point-of-test June 30, 2025, the projected RSE return on average common equity for the rate year ending September 30, 2025, was 9.82 percent, which was within the authorized range and results in no adjustment to rates. The authorized return on average common equity is 9.50 to 9.90 percent.

From the sixty-six (66) inspections shown above, four (4) enforcement letters of notification were issued leading to thirty-one (31) non-compliance items. There were fourteen (14) non-compliance items corrected during the month of June.

Miscellaneous

The Gas Pipeline Safety (GPS) program has begun participating in Public Damage Prevention Meetings held across Alabama. These events are organized by the Alabama Public Awareness Cooperative Training (APACT) and the Alabama Fire College's Alabama Pipeline Emergency Response Initiative (APERI) program. The meetings are designed to provide critical training on effective response to pipeline-related incidents and to promote public safety and damage prevention practices.

GPS staff are attending these meetings statewide to support outreach efforts, build stronger industry relationships, and emphasize the importance of compliance with pipeline safety regulations. The series of meetings is scheduled to conclude in late August.

RWS Staff attended the Heart of Dixie Rail Museum Rail Safety Day in Calera on June 6th. Each year, the museum partners with Operation Lifesaver to host Rail Safety Day on the first Friday in June. Numerous public safety and public service agencies and companies run booths and provide information to the public to raise awareness about a wide variety of safety topics.

As of June 30th, 8,191 Alabama carriers (90%) were registered for the 2025 UCR, with 909 remaining unregistered. Our office received funds from the UCR Depository for May online payments processed through the National Registration System (NRS) from 266 carriers domiciled in Alabama and non-participating states.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). Six MCS-150 forms were processed, containing updates to the motor carriers' USDOT number data.

MCS staff participated in the UCR Board call and the UCR Audit Q&A call during the month.

Staff received nine annual reports for the year ending 2024 during the month.

In June, two household goods tariffs for **Chasing Properties, LLC dba Transition Solutions (NEW)** and **D&G Emporium LLC (NEW)** were received and accepted. Also, one contract amendment for **Leslie M. Stone dba K3C Transportation (P650)** was accepted.

As of June 30, 2025, the Common Equity (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2025 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using both actual and budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 94.94%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated using actual data for the six months ended June 30, 2025, and then adding six months of budget data for July through December 2025. The Other Adjustments, if any, result from the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires reporting stock option expenses.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns, and economic conditions across the state.

Dockets 24860 On July 17, 2025, Alabama Power Company (the “Company”) filed a petition seeking to close Rate ILD (Incremental Load – Day Ahead) to new customers. The Company’s filing explains that Rate ILD is applicable to the service needs of certain industrial customers, but the pricing is predicated on a design used by Rate XRTPD, which was closed in 2019. The Company proposes to leave the rate on file as long as the single customer taking service under it continues to do so, but after such time, the Company would permanently withdraw Rate ILD from its list of available service options.

Recommendation: Approval

Docket U-3605 On July 17, 2025, Alabama Power Company (the “Company”) filed a petition seeking to withdraw Rate XRTPD (Real Time Pricing – Day Ahead). The Company’s filing explains that Rate XRTPD was closed to new customers on July 9, 2019, and since that action, all customers that previously took service under the rate have transitioned to service under a different, available rate option.

DOCKET 32606

(B) - Petition of Pinnacle Wastewater Systems, LLC ("Pinnacle" or "Petitioner") for approval to increase its tariffed monthly sewer rates. Pinnacle's petition, filed on December 27, 2024, proposed a phased-in increase of residential and vacant lot fees, with the first phase taking effect on March 1, 2025, and the second phase taking effect on March 1, 2026. Phase 1 would increase the monthly residential rate from the current rate of \$49.50 to \$59.50 and the monthly vacant lot fee from the current rate of \$15.50 to \$18.00. Phase 2 would further increase the monthly residential rate to \$62.33 and the monthly vacant lot fee to \$20.00. In the petition, Pinnacle supported its request through a reference to the Consumer Price Index.

On January 14, 2025, the Office of the Attorney General of Alabama ("Attorney General") intervened in the matter. On February 4, 2025, the Commission issued an order suspending the proposed tariff through August 28, 2025, to allow sufficient time for investigation and study of the requested changes.

A hearing was held on July 15, 2025, in which representatives from Pinnacle, the Attorney General, and Commission Staff were present and participated. The Petitioner offered sworn testimony at the hearing and several exhibits. At the hearing, Pinnacle failed to provide evidence to show that its proposed rates were based on the recovery of prudently incurred expenses. Instead, the Petitioner described operations conducted without employees, through a related third-party contractor, with much of the expenses involving work on customer-owned equipment. Pinnacle's operational model raises concerns related to Alabama law, Commission rules, and the setting of fair rates.

Recommend: Deny the Petition of Pinnacle Wastewater Systems, LLC for approval of an increase to its tariffed monthly sewer rates.

Direct Pinnacle Wastewater Systems, LLC to meet with Commission Staff (open to participation by the Office of the Attorney General of Alabama) concerning compliance issues and the potential filing of new proposed rates.

DOCKET 33481 (M) - Petition of National Mobility Eldercare, Inc. d/b/a Envoy America for cancellation of permit TNC-7.

Recommend: Grant cancellation as requested.

DOCKET 33543 (M) - Motor carrier application of Major H. Services LLC, of Pelham, Alabama, for a Certificate to transport passengers and their baggage. A hearing was held March 25, 2025 in which Commission Staff participated along with Protestant DTB of Alabama LLC. A Report and Recommended Order ("RRO") was entered in this cause on June 11, 2025, which recommended a grant of the authority sought. Exceptions to the RRO were timely filed by Protestant DTB of Alabama LLC and Replies to the Exceptions were timely filed by the Applicant.

Recommend: Grant of the authority sought as recommended in the RRO.

DOCKET 33602 (M) - Application of Gulf Coast Moving Services, LLC d/b/a Robinson Moving Services, of Orange Beach, Alabama, for a Certificate to transport household goods.

Recommend: Grant certificate and approval of tariff

DOCKET 33456 (G) - Petition to adjust rates filed by J. Paul and Kitty Whitehurst.

Recommend: Dismissal due to Petitioner's failure to support their claims and the relief requested. The billing submitted in support of the Petition appear to have been generated in a manner consistent with the controlling rate schedule on file with the Commission.

DOCKET 33513 G) - Petition of Alabama Power requesting the issuance of a certificate of public convenience and necessity seeking authorization to acquire existing combined cycle generating capacity known as the Lindsay Hill Generating Station ("Lindsay Hill" or "Lindsay Hill Facility") and all related facilities currently owned by Tenaska Alabama Partners, L.P. Said plant and facilities are located near Billingsley in Autauga County, Alabama. Petitions to intervene in this matter were timely filed by the Office of the Attorney General of Alabama and Energy Alabama and GASP ("Energy Alabama/GASP"). Both Petitions to Intervene were granted. A public hearing was held in this matter on April 15, 2025. Alabama Power and Energy Alabama/GASP each presented witnesses at the hearing. Alabama Power and Energy Alabama/GASP each submitted post-hearing briefs.

Recommend: After review of all of the pre-filed testimony, the transcript of the hearing and the post hearing briefs in the form of proposed orders, the Staff has determined that Alabama Power Company has demonstrated a need for additional capacity and presented evidence demonstrating that the Lindsay Hill Facility proposed by the Company represents a reasonable means by which the Company can meet this need in a reliable and economic manner. Accordingly, the Staff recommends the issuance of a certificate of convenience and necessity authorizing:

1. The acquisition of the Lindsay Hill power plant and facilities located near Billingsley in Autauga County, Alabama
2. Alabama Power Company to implement the rate and regulatory accounting treatments and otherwise tender all necessary filings and submissions to this Commission as discussed in its testimony, rebuttal testimony.
