- 7. A vehicle strike resulted in unknown injuries to the vehicle operator and railroad conductor in Mount Vernon on NS.
- 8. A derailment with a release of plastic pellets in Georgiana on THNR.

As of November 30th, 3,581 Alabama carriers (42%) were registered for 2025 UCR with 4,993 remaining unregistered. Our office received funds from the UCR Depository for October online payments processed through the National Registration System (NRS) that came from 3,042 carriers domiciled in Alabama and in non-participating states.

MCS staff attended a UCR call to give feedback regarding the Standards & Best Practices Course Review which is part of the UCR Learning Management System the UCR Board is creating.

The staff also assisted motor carriers in making necessary changes to their operating status with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There were four MCS-150 forms processed. One motor carrier had its USDOT number deactivated. Three forms contained updates to the motor carriers' USDOT number data.

There were four For Non-Profit (FNP) quarterly reports received from FNP carriers for the third quarter, one for the second quarter, and one for the first quarter of 2024.

In November, passenger tariffs for Johnny On The Spot Car Service LLC (C4168) and Inspirational NEMT Services, LLC (C4160) were received and accepted. Additionally, one passenger supplement for Angel Wing's Transport, L.L.C. (C4163) was accepted.

Staff participated in two passenger carrier hearings that were held during November for:

One desk audit was completed on the following household goods carrier:

The Common Equity as of November 30, 2024 (Actual) was adjusted using net income, payment of Common Stock and Preferred Stock dividends, Capital Contributions, and Other Adjustments from the Company's 2024 budget. The average common equity is a 12-month average using actual and budgeted data. The average retail common equity (RCE) was calculated using the retail separation factor of 95.28%. The retail net income (RNI) for average common equity and the common equity percentage (CEP) were calculated by using actual data for the eleven months ended November 30, 2024, and then adding one month of budget data for December 2024. The Other Adjustments, if any, are the result of the Company adopting FASB Statement 123 (R), which requires the reporting of stock option expenses.

The Forecast is subject to change due to uncertainties associated with weather, customer usage patterns, and economic conditions across the state.

On December 20, 2024, Alabama Power Company (the "Company") filed a petition seeking to modify Rate BTAL (Business Time Advantage – Large). The Company proposes to include language that acknowledges its right to negotiate terms and conditions in the contract for electric service that customers taking service under the rate typically execute if the service request reflects a load obligation in excess of 30,000 kVA. The Company's filing letter explains that comparable language exists in other rate schedules used for large load customers. The Company also notes that consistent with the requirements of the *Code of Alabama*, such negotiated terms and conditions would be subject to Commission approval.
